Miraculous Healing

Act 9:33-43 February 12, 2023

START TALKING | asking questions to get you thinking.

- 1. Who do children (as well as adults) rely on when they are not feeling well?
- 2. When someone is healed, when can it be called a miracle?

START SHARING | asking questions that engage with the message.

Pastor Steve defined Miraculous Healing as supernatural: There are no human explanations or coincidences. There were no doctors, medications or rehabilitation required.

- 3. Read Act 9:32-43. Describe the differences and similarities of the miraculous healings of Aeneas and Tabitha.
- 4. Read Acts 9:35, 9:42, and Acts 4:13-16. Explain how these miraculous healings are a witness and validation of Jesus' power over sickness and death.
- 5. How did these two miraculous healings affect those who witnessed them?
- 6. Read Matthew 9:1-7, John 9:1-3 and John 20:30. Describe how all healing miracles have a greater purpose.
- 7. Read Romans 5:12, 18-24, 8:23. What do these verses say about sickness/suffering and our future hope in heaven?

START LIVING | asking questions that apply God's Word to daily life.

- 8. Read James 5:16. How can you encourage someone who you know is sick and suffering?
- 9. How have you grown as a Christian in response to illness and healing in your life?
