The Promised Holy Spirit

DAY 1

Read John 14:1-4

1. How did Jesus begin His final instructions to His disciples?
2. Where did Jesus tell His disciples He was going?
3. What did Jesus promise He would do for His followers?
4. What comfort do you receive from the promise that Jesus will come back and take you to be with Him?
5. How do you picture the place that Jesus is preparing for you?

DAY 2

Read John 14:5-10

1. What does it mean when Jesus says: “I am the Way, the truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me?”
2. Do you believe that Jesus is the only way to God?
3. How can you know for sure that you are saved?
4. What was Philip’s request? Are you like Philip, wanting more proof? What would be “enough” for you to believe that Jesus is who He claimed to be?
5. What does Jesus mean when He says: “Don’t you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me?” Why is this so important?

DAY 3

Read John 14:11-14

1. How did Jesus authenticate His claim that He is one with the Father?

2. What do you think are the 'greater works' that Jesus is referring to in verse 12? Read Acts 1:8, 2:41; 2 Corinthians 3:16-18; Ephesians 2:4-9

3. What is your attitude when you pray? How often do you wait for God with great anticipation to see what He is going to do?

4. What do you think it means to pray in Jesus' name?

DAY 4

Read John 14:15-24

1. What does Jesus say is the proof that a person loves Him?

2. What other words does Jesus use to describe the promised Holy Spirit?
What comfort do you receive knowing Jesus has given us His Spirit?

3. What does it mean to you personally that Jesus has promised to never leave you?

4. What is the relationship that the believer has with the Father and the Son? (Verse 23)

DAY 5

Read John 14:25-31

1. What does it mean to you that the Holy Spirit is your Advocate? Who does the Bible say is the Accuser? (Revelation 12:10)

2. Jesus promised that the Holy Spirit “will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.” What does this mean for the accuracy and reliability of the New Testament?

3. How is the peace that Jesus offers different than the peace that the world gives?

4. Who is the prince of this world? Why do you think the prince of this world had no hold on Jesus?

DAY 6

Read John 14

1. What attribute of God was special to you this week as you studied this passage?

2. How can the group be praying for you?
