# Catching Fish

## DAY 1

### Read John 21:1-8

1. Where were Jesus' disciples when He appeared to them again?
2. Name the disciples that were there and what they were doing.
3. What did Jesus ask them in verse 5? Do you think that Jesus will ask you this question one day? (See also Matthew 4:19) What will you say?
4. Jesus called to them from the shore. What did He tell them to do and what was the result?
5. Who realized it was Jesus? What did Peter do?

## DAY 2

### Read John 21:9-14

1. What was Jesus doing when the disciples reached the shore?
2. How many fish did the disciples catch and what happened to the net?
3. Share with the group a time when God called you to do something specific. What was the result of your obedience?
4. How do you think the disciples knew it was Jesus?
5. How many times had Jesus appeared to His disciples including this time?

## DAY 3

### Read John 21:15-19

1. What question did Jesus ask Peter?
2. Why did you think Jesus asked Peter this same question three times? (Read John 18:15-18, 25-27)
3. What three things did Jesus ask Peter to do? Who are His sheep?
4. From what particular sin has Jesus delivered you?
5. What do you think Jesus meant in verse 18 and 19? What kind of death would Peter face and for what purpose?

## DAY 4

### Read John 21:20-25

1. What did Peter want to know about John in verses 20 and 21?
2. How did John's life glorify God?
3. What did Jesus mean when He said to Peter, "You must follow me"? What does it mean to you to follow Jesus?
4. Jesus speaks of His return in verse 23. How often do you think of the second coming of Christ? What excites you most about His return?
5. What comfort and assurance do you receive knowing that the Gospel of John is a trustworthy, eye-witness testimony?

## DAY 5

### Review the Gospel of John

1. What stands out to you most from our study of John this past year?
2. What are three new lessons or truths you have learned this year? How will you apply these lessons to your life?
3. How has your trust in and love for Jesus grown as you've studied this Gospel account of His life?
4. In what way has your personal prayer life changed this past year?
5. What will you plan to study this summer to keep yourself in God's Word every day?
