START TALKING | Get your group thinking.

- 1. Who's someone you can talk to about anything and why is that relationship so easy?
- 2. Have you ever experienced the power of others praying for you or when have you fervently prayed for someone else?

START SHARING | Get your group engaging with the message.

- 3. What is the difference between ordinary prayer and fervent prayer in real life?
- 4. As you read James 5:13-18, what stands out to you most about the way James talks about prayer? What words or phrases catch your attention and why?
- 5. James instructs the sick person to call the elders of the church to pray and anoint them with oil. What does that reveal about the communal nature of faith and prayer in the church?
- 6. Confession and healing are linked in v. 16: 'Confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed.' How does confession fit into the larger picture of prayer and spiritual restoration in this passage?

START LIVING | Get your group applying God's Word to daily life.

- 7. What would it look like to make fervent prayer a more regular part of your daily life not just in crisis moments, but in ordinary days? What small habit or rhythm could help you grow in that kind of prayer?
- 8. This passage shows believers praying for one another especially in suffering or sickness. How could our group or church family reflect that same pattern more intentionally this week?
