START TALKING | *Get your group thinking.*

1. What's one of the most random or funny things you have done while being a volunteer (whether at church, work, school, or just life)?

START SHARING | *Get your group engaging with the message.*

2. According to Romans 12:4-6, how does Paul describe the church, and why is the “body” metaphor important for understanding service?
3. Pastor Koby emphasized that every Christian is called and gifted. Where do you see that idea clearly in Romans 12:3-8 and 1 Peter 4:10?
4. In Romans 12:3, Paul begins this section by warning against thinking too highly of ourselves. Why do you think Paul starts there before talking about spiritual gifts and service?
5. We learned that spiritual gifts are given “*according to the grace given to us*” (Romans 12:6). What does that teach us about the source and purpose of spiritual gifts?

START LIVING | *Get your group applying God's Word to daily life.*

6. Considering that spiritual gifts are given by grace and meant for the good of the whole body (Rom. 12:4-8; 1 Peter 4:10) what might change if we viewed serving less as “helping out our church sometimes,” to “living out our faith at all times”?
7. Based on the message and what we've talked about, what is one specific step you could take *this week* to move toward serving (if you are not already)– whether that's exploring a ministry, having a conversation, or saying yes to an opportunity?
